We learned about local history, especially the Gold Rush, but I didn't get the chance to really learn about other cultures until my high school Spanish class, which fascinated me. I knew from the second week of my Freshman year that this was something I would like to spend my life studying, and I continued my Spanish classes throughout high school. I consistently received some of the highest grades in my Spanish classes, and never dropped below 93%. When I graduated high school, I had the opportunity to visit our exchange student and his family in Logroño, a small city in the north of Spain. And since visiting the country, I've longed to go back, especially now that I've been able to study the language and culture even more. I chose to study Spanish Language and Hispanic Cultures here at CSU Monterey Bay for this reason, and I do not regret my decision one bit.

I have been a student here for two semesters and I have already learned so much. My very first semester, I took a class about Chicano Studies with Prof. David Serena. This class was a great experience for me because it was all completely new information.
